DECISION

You were separated from your employment with EASTERN CONN. ST. UNIV. - STATE OF CT on 09/18/2025. It has been determined that **The claimant voluntarily quit his job for reasons not found to be good cause attributable to the employer.** The claimant failed to substantiate that he quit due to an adverse change in wages, hours, or working conditions. Therefore, it is concluded that the claimant voluntarily left suitable work under disqualifying circumstances, and he is denied benefits.. You have not shown good cause attributable to your employer for voluntarily leaving this employment. **You are disqualified from receiving Unemployment Insurance benefits beginning 09/14/2025.** The disqualification will continue until you have been reemployed and earned \$3,290.00, which is ten times your weekly benefit rate and provided that you are otherwise eligible.

LAW

Section 31-236(a)(2)(A) of the Connecticut General Statutes provides that an individual shall be ineligible for benefits if it is found that the individual has left suitable work voluntarily and without good cause attributable to the employer, until such individual has earned at least ten times his or her benefit rate, provided no individual shall be ineligible for benefits if the individual leaves suitable work for good cause attributable to the employer, including leaving as a result of changes in conditions created by the employer.

APPEAL RIGHTS

This decision shall be final and benefits shall be denied unless, within twenty-one calendar (21) days after the date of the mailing of this decision, you file an appeal in person, by Internet (your ReEmployCT webpage), by fax, or by mail. If you appeal this decision, you should continue to file your claims as directed while unemployed to protect your benefit rights. To be timely filed, your appeal must be received by the Employment Security Division or postmarked no later than **11/25/2025**.
