- On December 22, 2025, I attempted to end my life by overdosing on alcohol due to Eastern Connecticut State University (ECSU) and Connecticut State Colleges and Universities (CSCU) ignoring my requests for a Supportive Measure for housing after my Title IX Complaint with Eastern in 2025.

- What Happened: I drank 64 ounces of Jim Beam Peach Bourbon Whiskey all at once and was passed out for 24+ hours. I nearly died and landed in the ER at Rockville General Hospital in Vernon, CT on December 23, 2025.

- On December 24, 2025 (Christmas Eve), I was transferred to Manchester Memorial Hospital (MMH), which this discharge paperwork discusses.

- ECSU & CSCU's failure to even acknowledge my requests is a direct violation of 34 C.F.R. § 106.71 - Retaliation.

- ECSU & CSCU also refused to acknowledge requests I made to settle with them before I filed a Complaint with CT Commission on Human Rights and Opportunities.

- These medical problems resulted from a mixture of malnourishment and the alcohol consumption.

- Since ECSU lied to CT Dept. of Labor about my termination (Eastern told DOL I quit), I have had no money for food and I am too embarrassed to apply for SNAP benefits.

This is an error made by MMH staff.

My medical records show no signs of alcohol abuse.

This was the first time I ever consumed alcohol in life outside of wine for the Eucharist in Catholic Church.

- This shows that systemic retaliation is a true phenomenon, not a myth.

I voluntarily got a pneumonia vaccine since I was admitted to the ICU with pneumonia, likely from passing out in my car after my alcohol-induced suicide attempt. Winters in Connecticut are brutally cold.

Men typically get their first shot at age 50. I am 31, so I got the vaccine 19 years earlier than most males. Again, 34 C.F.R. § 106.71 exists to help prevent such health issues.
